Proposed Casselman Pipeline Project: Notice of Commencement and Public Information Sessions

Project Overview

Enbridge Gas Ontario (Enbridge Gas) is proposing a project to connect a producer of renewable natural gas to Enbridge Gas' distribution network in the municipalities of United Counties of Prescott and Russell, the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, and the City of Ottawa. The proposed project will involve the construction of 6-inch and 8-inch steel pipelines within existing municipal Right-of-Way and/or on privately controlled lands. Additional temporary working spaces may also be required to facilitate its construction.


The project area will require two geographically separated segments to accommodate the volume of renewable natural gas being added to the network. The Preliminary Preferred and Alternative Route options for each segment are shown on the accompanying figure.

Environmental Report

AECOM has been retained by Enbridge Gas to conduct an environmental assessment to assess potential environmental and socio-economic effects that may result from the proposed project. Evaluation of potential pipeline route options will be documented in an Environmental Report. The Environmental Report will be prepared in accordance with the Ontario Energy Board's Environmental Guidelines for the Location, Construction and Operation of Hydrocarbon Projects and Facilities in Ontario, 8th Edition (2023). Once complete, Enbridge Gas plans to file a Leave to Construct application for the project with the Ontario Energy Board. If approved, construction could begin in Q3 2026.
